

# **Separate wiring channels for high-voltage and low-voltage wires**





## Overview

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The Australian standard AS/NZS3000 or wiring rules provides guidance on how to segregate systems operating at different voltages that share common wiring pathways, as well as how to segregate between electrical and non-electrical services sharing pathways. ETC's preference is to keep data and power in separate conduits/trays because signal interference can occur when low voltage control wiring is run with branch power wiring. In California I am installing a SPDT relay to activate a circulation pump from my thermostats. Separation: Low voltage and high voltage wires need to maintain some distance from each other or be separated by a barrier within the conduit.
